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9 UPDATED EMERGENCY BAIL) GENERAL ORDER NO. 22-002
10 SCHEDULE ORDER)
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16 Effective January 18, 2022, the Court establishes the following Emergency Bail
17 Schedule. Bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses must be set at \$0, with the exception of
18 only the offenses listed below:

- 19 (1) A serious felony, as defined in Penal Code section 1192.7(c), or a violent felony, as defined
20 in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
21 (2) A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;
22 (3) A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);
23 (4) A violation of Penal Code section 136.1 when punishment is imposed under section 136.1(c);
24 (5) A violation of Penal Code section 262;
25 (6) A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
26 (7) A violation of Penal Code section 273.6 if the detained person made threats to kill or harm,
27 had engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the protected
28 party;
29 (8) A violation of Penal Code section 422 where the offense is punished as a felony;
30 (9) A violation of Penal Code section 646.9;

- 1 (10) A violation of an offense listed in Penal Code section 290(c);
- 2 (11) A violation of Vehicle Code sections 23152 or 23153;
- 3 (12) A felony violation of Penal Code section 463;
- 4 (13) A violation of Penal Code section 29800;
- 5 (14) A violation of Penal Code section 368; and
- 6 (15) A violation of Penal Code section 273(a) or 273(d).

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8 Any individual who it is alleged to have a previous serious or violent felony conviction, or a
9 weapons enhancement is alleged, bail will be set at the previous schedule.

10 An individual who was released from custody within the prior 60 days and has alleged to have
11 committed a new offense shall have bail set at the previous bail schedule for that offense.

12 Nothing in this order eliminates Penal Code 1269(c) for any individual the peace officer has
13 reasonable cause to believe the bail schedule is insufficient. If the officer wishes to follow that section,
14 the officer may contact dispatch to speak with a judicial officer and request that bail be set above
15 schedule.

16 Nothing in the Emergency Bail Schedule restricts the ability of the court to deny bail as
17 authorized by article I, section 12, or 28(f)(3) of the California Constitution.

18 This order terminates thirty days from today's date.
